EDUCATION & AWARENESS IDEAS

Learn and share the facts about child trafficking:

- Learn how child trafficking looks in your community.
- Learn who the most vulnerable are in your community.
- Attend training to understand how to respond to trafficking in your community.

Educate your congregation on how to identify, prevent and respond to trafficking.

- Host awareness events.
- Host an education session such as a panel or workshop
- Distribute educational materials
- Dedicate a religious service to encourage your congregants to learn more about child trafficking
- Host a meditation or prayer vigil in honor of trafficking victims

Share on Social Media and other media the importance of recognizing and reporting child trafficking.

- Share on Social Media and other media the importance of recognizing and reporting child trafficking.
- Write (and encourage congregants) blogs, articles or newsletters to reach congregants and the community at-large.
- Use appropriate hashtags (e.g., #Endtrafficking #bluecampaign, etc.) to amplify the importance of this issue in your community.

Show solidarity with survivors

- Incorporate National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month (January) into services/ events.
- Incorporate National Human Trafficking Day (January 11th) into services/ events.
- Conduct a service during international awareness day or world day against trafficking in persons.
- Meditation service
- Shabbat dinners
- Iftar meals
- Social justice events



IDEAS FOR INCREASING AWARENESS & ACTION

PREVENTION IDEAS

- Create programs that serve marginalized and vulnerable individuals within your congregation and community.
- Pay attention to the physical, emotional, and environmental cues that may be red flags or indicators of human trafficking.
- Advocate for legislation to advance anti-trafficking efforts both locally and globally.

REPORTING IDEAS

Place the National Human Trafficking Hotline number in strategic locations throughout your place of worship.

- For example: Bathrooms, back of chairs in the sanctuary, common areas, spaces where kids/youth hangout within the place of workshop.
- Provide hotline postcard as part of your community resources and include it in service programs or bulletins.

Child sex trafficking is a form of child sexual abuse and is a mandated report to Child Protective Services.

• Make sure your congregants have the information necessary to report a potential trafficking situation.

WELCOME & REFER IDEAS

Create a welcoming environment for trafficking survivors. For many survivors, having a strong faith-community is a source of social, emotional and spiritual support.

Apply the 3Cs:

- Be Compassionate.
- Be Cautious.
- Make the Call.

PARTNERING IDEAS

Community Partnerships

- Identify law enforcement and social service organization working to address child trafficking and consider ways to help spread the word.
- Join your local task force or interfaith coalition.
- Encourage members of your congregation to volunteer with local anti-trafficking efforts.
- Connect with other faith leaders of other congregations to share your efforts and knowledge.

Training Partnerships

- Seek available training in your area and encourage congregants to participate
- Encourage congregants in law enforcement, social services, hospitality/service, and healthcare to receive and promote child trafficking awareness and response training.

Global Partnerships

• Support local partnerships and global anti-trafficking efforts with missions' funds, donations, and fund raisers.
